Work Plan April 2023 - March 2024

- 1. Campaigning: NEMT will
 - 1.1 Work on moorland management, including mountain hare populations
 - 1.2 Work on the need to reduce deer populations
 - 1.3 Work on woodland creation, focussing on more regeneration, less fencing and appropriate sites
 - 1.4 Work on reducing the off-track impact of mountain biking
- 2. Monitoring: NEMT will
 - 2.1 Raise access issues, as advised by members, with authorities and estate owners
 - 2.2 Respond to relevant consultations undertaken by the Scottish Government and statutory bodies, such as the Cairngorms National Park Authority
 - 2.3 Monitor and comment on applications for wind farms in sensitive landscapes and areas covered by NatureScot's wild land map, prioritising the North East
 - 2.4 Continue to support the LINK Hill-tracks Group

3. Disseminating

- 3.1 Two editions of *Mountain Views* will be published and sent to all Members
- 3.2 Six lectures will be organised on relevant themes
- 3.3 Develop electronic methods as appropriate, e.g., the website and Facebook
- 4. Governance: The Trustees will
 - 4.1 Regularly review NEMT's finances and submit an annual report to OSCR
 - 4.2 Hold six Trustees meetings and an AGM
 - 4.3 Work to maintain, and increase, the Individual and Organisational Membership
 - 4.4 Ensure that affairs are ordered in line with winding up the Trust within four years
